Ribble Undergraduate Research Scholarship

Are you conducting research this semester? **Do you want \$2000?** Continue the research next semester and win \$1000 this semester and the next.

The Biology Department encourages research activity by awarding the **Gertrude Flora Ribble Research Scholarships** to Biology majors engaged in research. The Ribble Research Scholarship, administered by the Biology Department, will support up to 4 students each semester for two consecutive semesters with awards of \$1,000 per semester each (for a total of \$2,000 each).

Biology Scholars

Any Biology major working toward the requirements below is considered a **Biology Scholar**. Biology Scholars earn Departmental Honors and will be recognized at graduation, receive a certificate from the department, and have this designation noted on their transcript.

- If you qualify for Biology Scholars and are graduating in December, make sure to submit an application.
- If you are graduating in a future semester, consider the Biology Scholars when you plan your courses.

Biology Scholars Requirements

- Complete 6 hours of Independent Research (BIO 394, BIO 395, BIO 397, or BIO 398).
- Have an overall 3.5 GPA upon graduation.
- Complete two biology scholars courses (aka Honors courses/sections) or two 400G*, 500 or 600** level course that is an accepted Biology elective (check here), or a combination of a BIO scholars course and a 400G/500/600 Biology elective course. Honors conversion for a Biology elective or Tier I or Tier II Core course is also acceptable.
- Publicly present your research results or write a thesis.

Plant of the Week

This weeks plant is an *Rhipsalis sulcata*, which is an is an epiphytic cactus. It is a CITES listed species, which means that it is internationally agreed to be a highly endangered species.
